Programs of Study: Business Management.

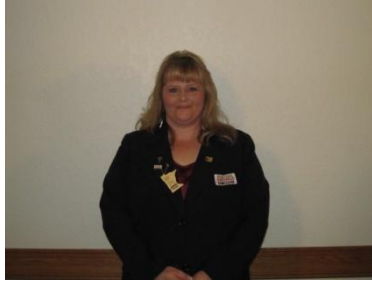
Greatest accomplishment as a BPA member: Learning to be strong and positive, and being able to talk in front of people.
